Little Brother

- Scout 1: Whatcha doing?
- Scout 2: Writing a letter to my little brother.

Scout 1: Why are you writing so slowly?

Scout 2: Because my little brother can't read very fast!

Walk-ons

Scout: "The squirrels are after me! The squirrels are after me! Leader: "Why on Earth would squirrels be after you?" Scout: "They think I'm nuts!"

Scout: Walks on stage tossing a ball up in the air a foot or two and catching it. Leader: "What are you doing?" Scout: "Throwing up!"

Scout: Runs up to the leader on stage, starts grabbing at his own clothes, as though he has bugs on him, and says, "They're on me, they're on me!" Leader: "What's on you?" Scout: "My clothes!" and walks offstage.

Scout: Hey, there! I'm up in a 10,000 foot pine tree! Leader: But there aren't any 10,000 foot pine trees in camp. Scout: Are you sure? Leader: Of course I am! Scout: (Shrieks as if falling) -- Aieee! (Thuds to floor)

Scout walks onstage singing: Soap...soap...soap! Leader: Now what are you doing? Scout: Oh, just singing a few bars!

Scout: Well, the other day a girl rolled her eyes at me. Leader: Really? What did you do? Scout: I picked them up and rolled them right back!

Could sing, "This is my camp song" between each venyet (Song to You Are My Sunshine)

This is my camp song, my only camp song It makes me happy when skis are gray Won't you sing my camp song, my only camp song? Please don't take my camp song way

Emergency Test

A group of Scouts come out and stand in a line across the stage. One, the announcer, stands in front of them.

Announcer: "This is a test"

Announcer: This has been a test of the emergency warning system. This was only a test. If there had been a real emergency we would have said... (Scouts throw hands over heads, yell "Ahhhhhh", and run helter-skelter off stage)

Community Sneeze

While seated, the group is divided into three sections. The leader then asks the first section to say together "HISH" two or three times for practice. The second section "HASH" and the thrid section "HOSH". Then he asks the first section to add "EE" as in "HISHEE", the second section "HASHEE", the third "HOSHEE". The leader then tells the group to say their word in unison at his signal. The ensuing sound is like an enormous sneeze.

The Lawnmower

Cast: 4 Cubs and a Leader or use "helpers" from the audience. Setting: 1 Cub on his hands and knees as the mower Owner: (Yanking imaginary rope, while mower sputters) This darned old mower, I can't get it going. I need some help. Helper #1: So you just want me to yank on this rope, and get it started? That's easy! (Yanking rope) Mower: (Sputters, bobs up and down) Helper #1: I'm sorry, I can't seem to do it. Have you checked the gas? Owner: Yes I have. Thanks anyway. Well, let's see who else has a strong arm. What I need you to do is to give a real good yank on the starting rope and make it run. Helper #2: Sure thing. (Yanks rope a couple of times) Mower: (Bobs up and down, sputters and coughs) Helper #2: Sorry, I can't do it either. Owner: What I need is someone big and strong (selects a leader and gets him to pull on the rope) Mower: (Sputters, coughs, starts to vibrate and run) Owner: There, all I needed was a big jerk!

Once Upon A Time

The den members stand in a line side by side facing the audience.

2nd Cub in line: "This story begins with, Once upon a time...."

1st Cub in line: "Hey, wait a minute, I'm the beginning".

Middle Cub in line: "I'm the middle".

Last Cub in line: "That's nothing, I'm the end".

No Skit

Scene: Stand the boys in line. Skit works best with 4-8 boys.

Cub Scout 1: Oh, no! Cub Scout 2: What's the matter? Cub Scout 1: (Whispers to Cub 2. No one hears them) Cub Scout 2: Oh, no! Cub Scout 3: What's the matter? Cub Scout 2: (Whispers to Cub 3. No one hears them. This continues down the line) Second to last Cub, to the last Cub: Oh, no! Last Cub: What's the matter? Second to last Cub: (Whispers loud enough for everyone to hear) We don't have a skit! (Everyone exits)

Falling Rock

Cast: 7 Cubs - (1 narrator, 1 Chief dressed as such or with sign, 4 dressed as Indians, 1 is Prop Boy)

Props: 3 signs "TIME PASSES", "7 SUNS", "WATCH OUT FOR FALLING ROCKS"

Setting: Narrator stands to the side, Chief and all Indians sit in semi-circle on stage. Prop Boy to the side of stage.

Narrator: This is the story of how a Chief was chosen between two sons of the old and dying Chief Thundercloud. Both of the sons are young warriors, strong and brave and wise in the ways of the red man.

Chief: I call a council of my tribe so we may decide which of my two sons -Falling Stars or young Falling Rock - will lead you as Chief, for I am old and must soon go to the happy hunting grounds.

Brave #1: Young Falling Rocks! Young Falling Rocks! He is wise and brave. Let us choose young Falling Rocks!!

Brave #2: Young Falling Stars!! He is brave and strong. Let us choose young Falling Stars so that he may lead us bravely in battle against our enemies.

Chief: We must choose wisely, both are good and brave. My sons, go forth alone, one toward the rising sun and one towards the setting sun. Return with the full moon and we shall decide.

(Sons get up and leave in different directions. Prop Boy crosses the stage with the sign "TIME PASSES".)

Brave #2: It is time of the full moon and Falling Stars has returned with many stories of his achievements and bravery; but Falling Rocks has not returned.

Brave #1: We would choose Falling Stars for our Chief.

Chief: We must be fair, we wait 7 suns for Falling Rocks. Then we choose.

Narrator: 7 suns pass (Prop Boy crosses stage with "7 SUNS" sign) Falling Rocks did not return so Falling Stars was made the new Chief. Falling Rocks never did return, and even though this happened many, many years ago, the Indian tribe is still looking for him. That is why today, as we ride along the roads in the mountains, we see this sign (Prop Boy crosses stage with sign "WATCH FOR FALLING ROCKS")
